Dear Parent /Guardian,

As you already know our school has an established emergency response plan. As part of the plan each year our school practices various safety procedures with our students and staff. Teachers discuss the procedures with their students, explaining how and when the procedures would be used. In order to ensure that our students and staff would be able to execute the procedure should an emergency occur, we rehearse the procedures through drills. These drills are conducted at various times throughout the school year, and sometimes in concert with emergency responders such as police or fire.

To properly prepare students, and ensure they are not frightened by the proceedings, teachers will be discussing the drills with students both prior to and following the event.

We wanted to make certain you were aware of our plans so you could discuss the drill with your child, and to advise you that no visitors will be permitted into the school during a drill. If you happen to call or arrive at the school during the drill you will be redirected or instructed to call back following the drill.

Next week we will be practicing the following drill with our students:

LOCK-DOWN: Used for threat of violence inside the school. During LOCK-DOWN students and staff will retreat to lockable rooms and will lock the doors.

While we hope we never have to actually use the procedure, we want to make sure all of our students and staff are well prepared to execute the procedure should the need arise.

Thank you for your support and cooperation in ensuring the continuing safety of our students. Should you have any questions or concerns regarding drills or other safety concerns, please feel free to contact the school principal.
