Interpretation & Strategies:

School results have increased significantly since 2014-15. The Acceptable Standard has been at 100 percent for three of the past four years. The Acceptable Standard has been higher than the Province since 2015-16, by almost 10 percent each year. Avondale School is approaching the Province in percentage of students achieving the Standard of Excellence. 17.4 percent of students achieved excellence in Reading in 2018-19, while 4.3 percent of students achieved excellence in Writing.

Students are part of reading groups formed as a result of the skills and strategies they are currently working on. These groups are comprised of students in Grades 4-6. This grouping enables certain skills to be targeted more directly, and for students to be challenged at their current level.

Balanced Literacy instruction is the norm in every classroom from Kindergarten to Grade 6. All students write and read in small groups or 1:1, everyday.

Interpretation & Strategies:

Avoidale School scores increased significantly in 2017-18 and remained high in 2018-19. Both years, the percentage of students achieving the Acceptable Standard has been higher than that of the Province. School Standard of Excellence for Part B at 13.0 percent is approaching the perentage of the Province at 19.1 percent.

All Math strands are reviewed daily through a Daily Math Review.

High-achieving Math students in Grades 4-6 participate in a Math problem-solving group throughout the year, preparing them to participate in national tests.

Report to School Councils

November 2019

November 1 had sod turning ceremony at the new Comp High School. Signs are up at the site, Opening set for the 2021-22 school year. (This year's grade 9s will be the first graduates of the new school) Expect by the end of this month to see work being done on site.

We have 3 trustees sitting on a committee for the Avondale North Area Redevelopment plan. With the new location of the comp as well as new replacement school for Harry Balfour announced, and Peace Wapiti's desire to move PWA out into the county - there is opportunity for some interesting things in the area.

GPPSD budget for school year – a letter with information was sent out with the details of our budget concerns. Trustees and Central Office Admin are in discussions with MLAs and Education Minister's office to try to advocate for some additional assistance due to our situation of having low reserve amounts due to opening of multiple new schools.

AB Gov choice in Education survey – open until December 6. Encourage all to complete the survey with the thoughts in mind about what choice looks like in schools, can it be offered within public system with public dollars (like our Academy, Montessori, and GP Christian School programs) or does it have to mean privatization, and public money used to support that. Is it in the best interest of all of our students to be educated together, as opposed to families that can afford it separated from the rest. (can google Alberta choice in education survey to find it online to find the survey)
