Staffing and Student Population Update

Current student enrollment is 177, we had 183 at this time last year.

Mental Health Support- Avondale will have 1 social worker this year. Nadine Jackson. She will be at Avondale approximately two days a week. Indigenous Liaison Worker- Danica Napesis will be with us Monday/Fridays

- District Elementary Intervention Literacy and Numeracy Intervention Program.
- Our school has two 1.0 EA's (Mandi Plant) who will be working with students who need more support in literacy and numeracy. K-4
- ELL/ Indigenous intervention targeted for our grades 4-6. (Liz Knelsen)
- Elder Darlene Cardinal- is joining us again at Avondale. She will be in the building on Monday afternoons and will be working with all the classes. (Seven Sacred teachings, Treaty 8, respect, and acceptance)

• The Nutrition Program is up and running again. There is a need in our community. Please share this information with any school community members who may need support or would benefit from the program.

Recent News

- Alberta Education has mandated screeners (assessments) for students in kindergarten to grade 3. Divisions across the province will administer a variety of screeners, depending upon the grade at scheduled times throughout the year. Universal screeners (assessments) measure a student's proficiency with foundation skills in both literacy and numeracy skills.
- We have been very busy completing mandated assessments for students in K-3 as well as our division literacy and math screening in grades 4-6
- Avondale is also participating in the piloting of DIBELS and Core Multiple Measures of Reading (CRRM) to evaluate and recommend a standardized tool for grades 1-8. Which will begin in October. Previously, we were using Fountas and Pinnell to help benchmark our students in literacy measures.
- A new ministerial order restricting mobile devices and social media was released this fall. Avondale has historically had a policy in place restricting personal mobile devices in school so the impact of this order has been non-existent.

- Our morning PL will with our Division Literacy Coordinator, Diana Smith, She will be working with our teachers to reinforce students' writing skills. Together they will collaboratively explore the writing process, confirm that student learning advances from grade to grade, and determine connections to other key areas of the curriculum
- We are also working with Tracie Anthony to support our work in responsive planning with the new math curriculum. We are partnering with Swanavon in the afternoon PL times so that staff can work with a collaborative grade-level partner.
